The declaration must be signed by both partners. The final decision to allow or deny entry into the country is made by border guards upon arrival.

Exemption from travel restrictions does **not** grant exemption from screening and quarantine requirements – further information can be found on www.covid.is/en. If this form is not correctly completed when presented it can lead to refusal of entry at the border.

Make sure you have all the necessary documents to be provided upon arrival

- A valid travel document (passport).
- A valid visa (if applicable).
- Joint declaration on long-term intimate relationship (see form B).
- Confirmation of Icelandic citizenship of boyfriend/girlfriend OR copy of a valid residence permit of a boyfriend/girlfriend.
- Border guards may, if necessary, request further confirmation of intimate relationship, such as photographs; copies of e-mails, messages or any other form of communication that have been sent between the parties; and/or that the couple have met in person at least once (e.g. by stamps in passports or travel documents). It is recommended, therefore, that persons carry such documentation with them to confirm their relationship.
